

Assembly of 30-Compartment Cell Phone Locker

All bolts are to be inserted on outside of locker while all nuts are to be fastened on the inside of the locker.

Step One:

Remove unassembled locker from shipping packing and identify all parts as shown below.

(3) Front Door - Frame

(3) Back Panel

(4) Side Panels Panels are identical

Panels are identical for convenience

(27) Compartment Panels (6) Top/Bottom Panels Top/Bottom are identical








Panel Flanges








Step Two:

- Place back panel on flat even floor or pair of saw horses.
- Lightly bolt left panel to the inside of each back panel flange.



View of the locker with back panel on the floor or saw horses

Top holes are 1/2" at the top of each panel shown.


Back Panel Flanges





Step Three:

- 1 Insert side panel inside back panel flange.
- Insert tamper-proof screws through back panel flanges, side panels and ② back flange left side and light bolt.
- Repeat for 2 back and side panel and 3 back and side panel.
- See illustration below.




Never assemble side panels between back panels flanges!






Step Three

- Lightly bolt (27) compartment panels inside both side panels and back panel in 1, 2, 3.
- Lightly bolt top, (2) bottom legs and bottom panels inside both side panels and back panel*.
- * Note: Both bottom and top panels are identical.



Step Four

- Once the top/bottom panels have been assembled, insert front door frame on the outside of the left, right
- and bottom panels.



Step Five

- Set locker upright and ensure that the locker is level. Legs may need to be adjusted.
- Once level, ensure that all compartment doors open properly. Adjusting bolts as needed will allow compartment doors to open and close, if problems occur.
- If doors operate correctly, tighten all bolts.
- In the interest of safety, we highly recommend anchoring the locker to prevent injury or theft.
